

A unique way of working

ithin days of Covid-19 Lockdown being announced, a network of Tāmaki community leaders, backed financially by Tāmaki Regeneration Company and Waipareira Trust, pulled together an informal group called Tāmaki Whānau. This group was formed at short notice by key community leaders, tapping into support from volunteers who were born and bred residents of the area, to support anyone in need within the Tāmaki community.

The group focused on ensuring that families who were struggling would receive food parcels that included cleaning and hygiene products. Families were supported by connecting them to existing services in the community, such as churches and NGOs, as well as delivering education packs and devices to children who did not have access to laptops, on behalf of the Ministry of Education. Many of the families who had food parcels dropped off to them had never

previously asked for assistance.

The group is proud of their response to a situation that had never been experienced before:

- Local leaders stepped up
- Whānau leaders stepped up
- Speed of connecting the groups
- Groups resources were equally shared
- Great messages via cartoons and pictures
- No reported corona virus cluster in our community
- And most importantly of all was the strengthening of trust between community and Tāmaki Regeneration Company

This collaboration between so many people did not happen anywhere else in New Zealand, something that we should all be proud of.
