"Transforming Downtown Auckland" - November 2018

Summary of current CCRG position on Downtown projects.

- 1. General
 - The Waterfront Plan and City Centre Master Plan should apply to all of these proposals and outcomes
 - Planning should emanate from an initial consideration of planning for Queens Wharf i.e. it appears that individual projects are driving the wharf rather than the other way around
- 2. We are supportive of increased public space in the city centre but oppose the proposed *Downtown Public Space* and the for the following reasons:
 - Public space should not be created by taking harbour space
 - A significant public space in this general area should be located away from the noise and height of the city, with genuine proximity and connection to the harbour edge
 - The design facilitates the loss of public amenity, both existing and potential on the entire western edge of Queen Wharf
 - \circ The design is not sympathetic to the history or original nature of the area
 - The design compounds the issue of cruise industry berthing through creating limitations on Princes Wharf
 - The location of the public space compromises ferry berthing
- 3. We propose an *Alternative City Centre Public Space* at the north western end of Queens Wharf (see attached drawing)
 - A permanent public space be secured at the north eastern portion of Queens Wharf
 - The roof of Shed 11 be returned (post Cloud removal) to this site to provide shelter and shade from the elements
 - That people seek human scale in their public spaces quieter, calmer, some respite from the energy of the city centre, third places where interaction and recreation can occur
 - A corridor of secured pedestrian space be created to create the link between Lower Queen St and Queens Wharf
 - If there is a requirement for vehicle movement on Queens Wharf e.g. tour buses that as far is as practicable all vehicle movement be limited to the very southern end of the wharf
 - Queens Wharf should be a natural extension of Queen St from the city to the sea
 - That the investment and purchase of the "People's Wharf" be honoured by giving priority to the securing and creation of a permanent public space
- 4. We are supportive of ferries but oppose the proposed *Downtown Ferry Basin Redevelopment* for the following reasons
 - Ferries should berth as close to Quay St as possible, bringing commuters directly to their city centre destination or point of transfer to other public transport
 - Is there a long term strategy around ferries in Auckland being applied to this set of projects?
 - The design prioritises maritime infrastructure over public amenity along the entire western edge of Queen Wharf
 - We question the accuracy of the number of new berths vs those lost in the overall set of downtown projects

- 5. In principle we agree with the *Quay St Enhancement* but without detailed plans it is difficult to create a full submission on the proposal and we seek consideration of:
 - Improved pedestrianisation in an area that will have a lot of commuter movement
 - Clear delineation of cycle ways
 - That waterfront plan intentions of the east/west stitch and promenade be retained
 - We question with concern the parameters of the stated "increasing space for events and trading opportunities"
 - Increased appropriate vegetation is very welcome
- 6. We agree with the need for Quay St Strengthening
- 7. We oppose the construction of the *Mooring Dolphins* as per our joint submission to the current resource consent for these structures and seek that cruise industry infrastructure be located to the east of Queens Wharf
- 8. We think ? the Downtown Bus Interchanges
 - Greater detail in general is required on these interchanges before a useful response can be made???
